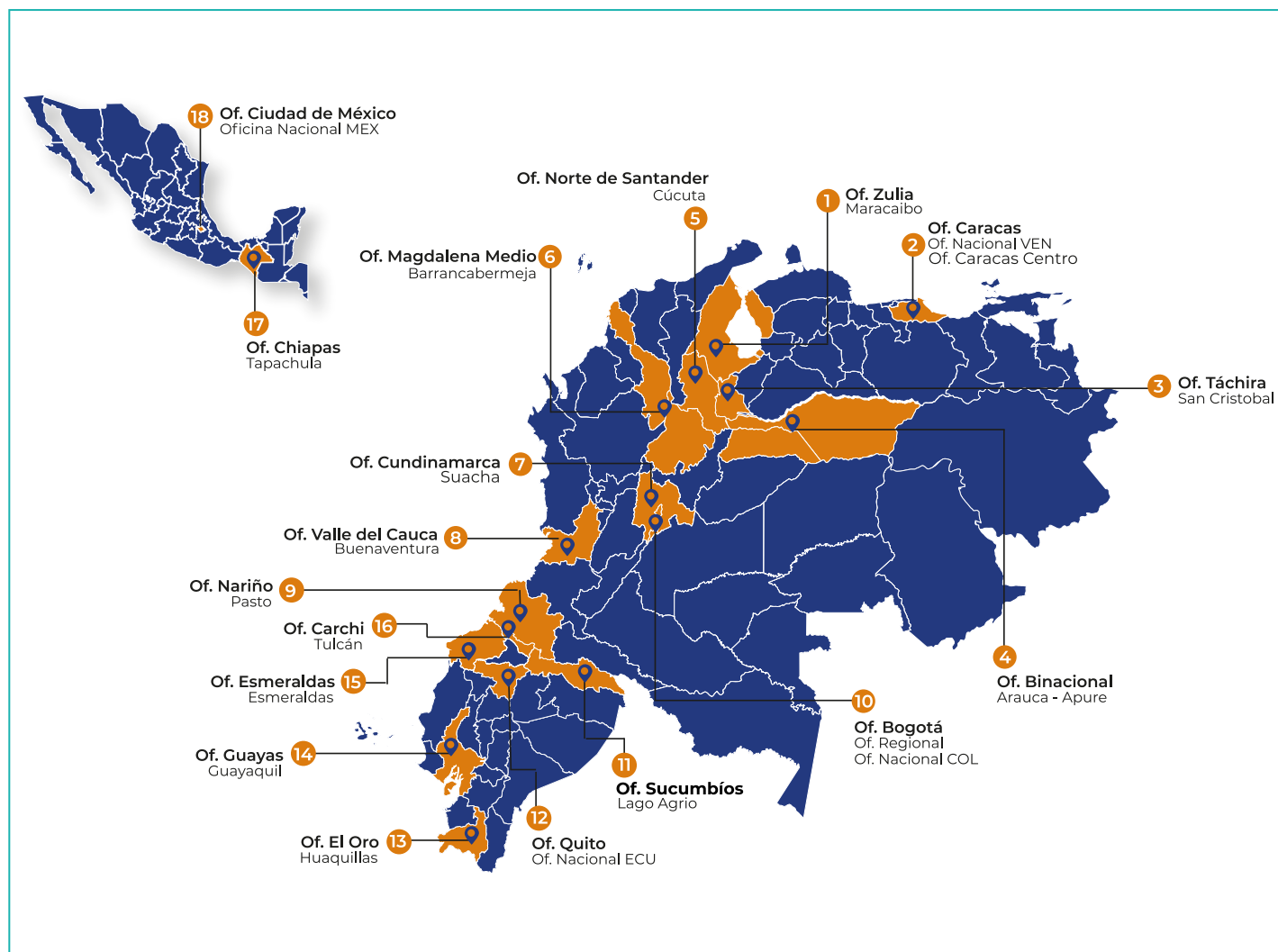

REGION MAP

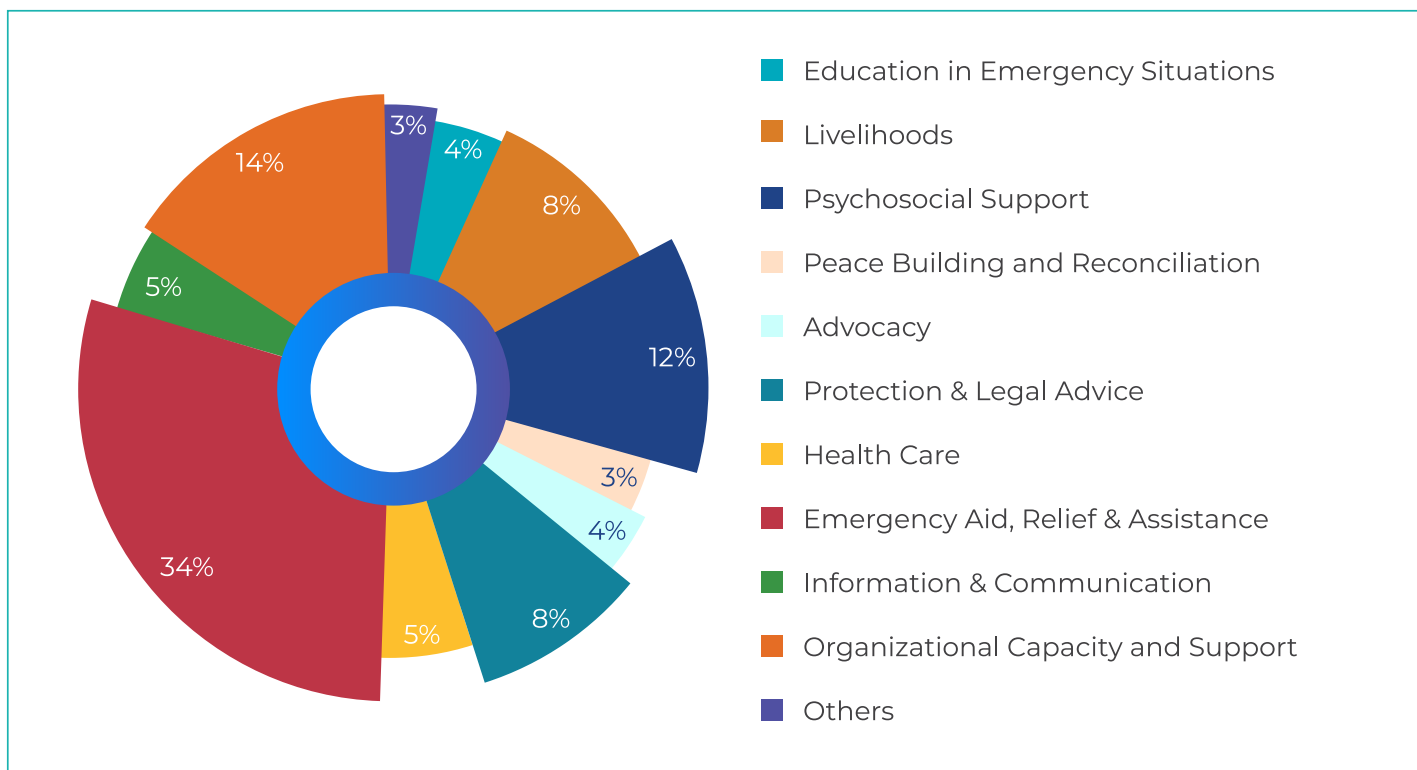

Education in Emergency Situations

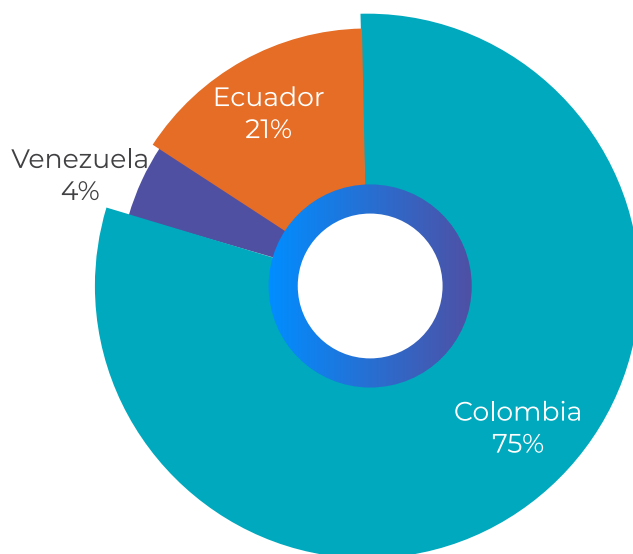

Livelihoods

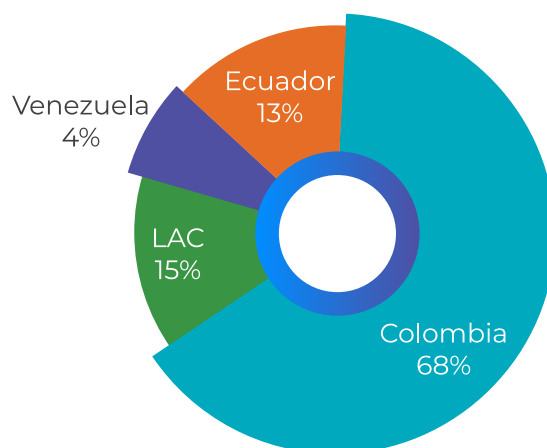

Psychosocial Support

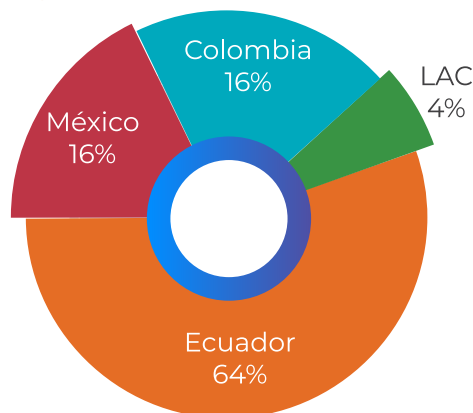

Peace Building and Reconciliation

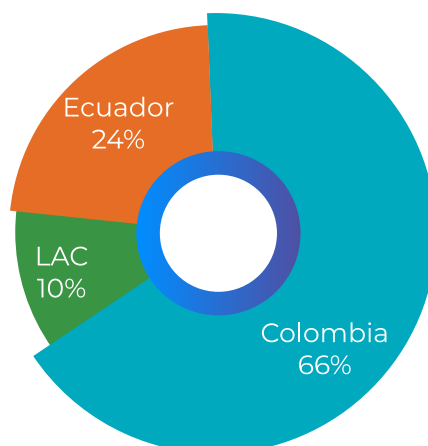

Advocacy

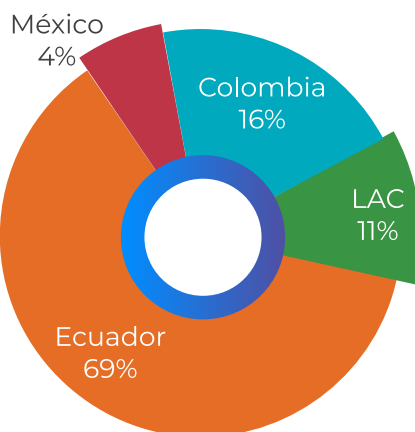

Protection & Legal Advice

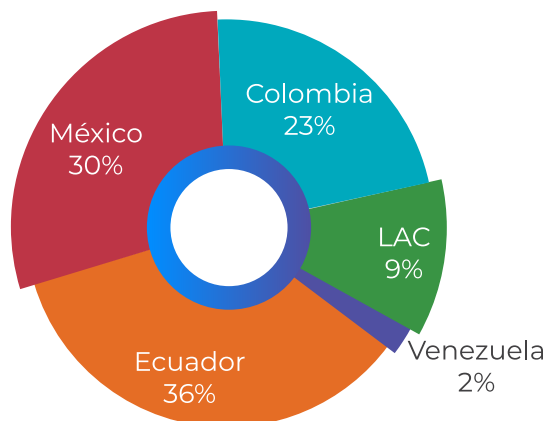

Health Care

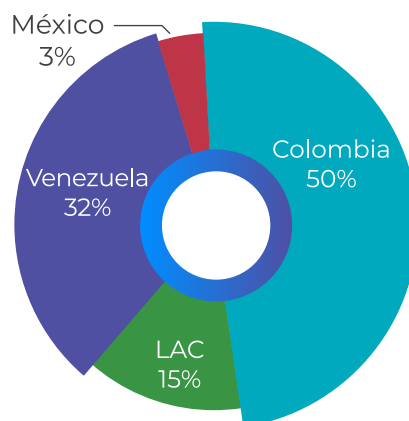

Emergency Aid, Relief & Assistance

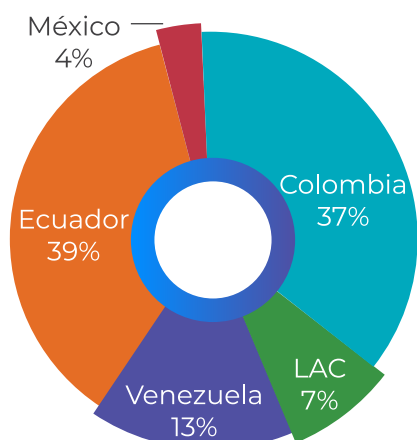

Due to the high migratory flows in the region, humanitarian accompaniment has been developed in a comprehensive manner with I legal orientation, psychosocial support, livelihoods and community strengthening, among other processes. The main purpose of emergency relief is to save lives.

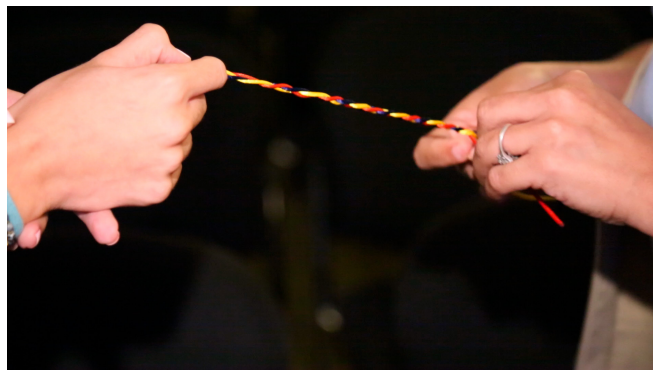

Information & Communication

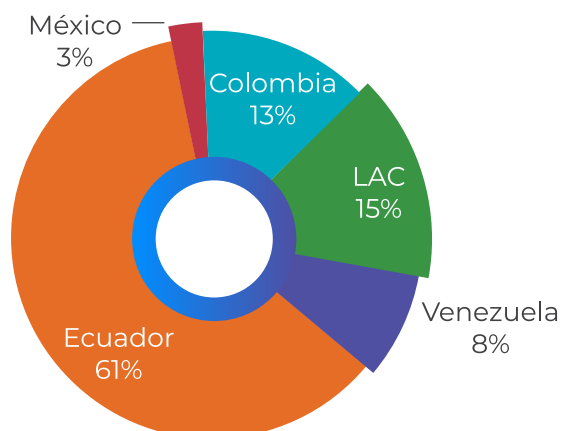

Research

JRS contributes to refugee research with several academic and non-academic partners and communities carrying out multidisciplinary research on the causes and consequences of forced migration, with an emphasis on understanding the experiences from the point of view of affected peoples.

During 2020, the LAC region invested **USD \$ 115,776** in research and systematization of experiences that strengthen the execution of comprehensive processes and the analysis of the rights situation of refugees, migrants and displaced persons.



Organizational Capacity and Support

JRS achieves greater international unity by developing a well-coordinated inductions and ongoing trainings (e.g. orientation courses, in-service training).

JRS consolidates its organizational effectiveness and unity through a consistent application of policies and protocols, consistent monitoring of project quality at regional and national levels, the implementation of internal and external evaluations and financial audits, and the continuous improvement of its accountability processes with donors and strategic allies.

During 2020, the LAC region invested **USD \$1,424,349** in institutional strengthening processes of the regional and national offices.
